

What to do in KL

KL is the capital city of multi-cultural country, Malaysia. Skyscrapers on the one side and shopping malls on the other. Famous for its street foods all over the world. Unlike other Asian countries, Kuala Lumpur is something different. It has its own night life. Local people are really good and always ready to help travelers. City sleeps only at 3am. Tourism plays an important role in city's service-driven economy. It is the sixth most visited city in the world. Moving in the city is really comfortable for tourist.

If you are staying in Puduraya or Bukit Bintang, the whole city is walkable. All the places are well connected by Bus and train. Driving in the city can be adventures due to pathetic traffic (😞 you are not used to it).

Golden Triangle is the most amazing and centered place in KL. It is called golden triangle- KL towers and PETRONAS on one side and Berjaya Times Square on the other side. These are the tourist centered places.



Menara KL Tower

Stands at a breathtaking height of 421 meters, **sixth tallest telecommunication tower in the world**. Mainly used for telecommunication and broadcasting transmission. It stands near to KL Eco forest Park. Free shuttle bus service every 10 mins from the main gate at Jalan Puncak to KL Tower. It includes KL Tower Animal Zone, Pony Ride, F1 Simulator, Blue Coral Aquarium, and Observation Deck at 276 meters above ground level, Revolving Restaurant just below it and XD Theater.

Entry fee: 49 RM for Observation Deck (Th01) and 99 RM for Building Service Floor (TH05).

Open from: 9am till 10pm (Daily)

Recommended length of Visit: 3-4 hrs

How to Reach: 10 mins walk from Monorail Bukit Nanas

Tips: Go around 5pm (Best view of the city at this time)



KLCC Park

Entry Fee: Free

Recommended length of Visit: 2-3 hrs

How to Reach: Take LRT train, KLCC Station (Red color-Kelana Jaya, towards Gombak)

Tips: Go at night, awesome fountain show (It feels really



PETRONAS Twin Towers

Just opposite to KLCC park stands the PETRONAS twin towers at a height of 452 meters. The 88th floors are constructed largely of reinforced concrete with a steel and glass facade design. The towers features a Sky Bridge on 41st floor- there is no view like it.

Entry fee: 40 RM for Adult and 20 RM for Children (Observation deck and Sky Bridge)

Open from: Monday (closed)

Tue-Fri: 9.30- 5.30pm (last admission 4pm)

Sat, sun and public holiday: 9.30- 6.30 pm (Last admission 5 pm)

Recommended length of visit: 2-3 hrs

BATU Caves

On the same day go to BATU Caves. Take a taxi to KL Sentral from Bird Park-15 RM. It's a must visit place. Full of monkeys. Cave is really amazing from inside. The best part is the location. It's a Hindu temple but visited by every tourist who come to KL.

Fee: Free

Open from: 7am to 8.30pm

How to Reach: Take KTM commuter directly to BATU Caves from KL Sentral (2 RM each)

Recommended Length of Visit: 2 Hrs

Tips: You need to climb 272 steps to reach the Limestone Cave. Go in the afternoon.



KL Hop on Hop off

Best way to see the KL city. It operates 7 days a week covering almost 40 destinations in KL including major hotel areas. Tickets can be purchased online, through any agents, from major hotels and bus station.

Fee: RM 45 –Standard Adult ticket (valid for 24 hrs)

RM 79- Standard Adult ticket (Valid for 48 hrs)

Open from: 7 days a week, from 9 am until 8 pm (every 30 mins)

KL Bird Park

It's the largest Bird Park in World covering 21 acres of land. It's an open bird park so you will find birds flying over your head. It's amazing. It's a must visit place for everybody.

Fee: 48 RM per person (for above pic you need to pay 10 RM)

Open from: 9am to 6pm (Daily)

How to Reach: Taxi, 10 mins from KL Sentral (If you will walk, at the back side of Central Market 15 mins walk- just cross the road through underpass and walk for another 10 mins, first is the butterfly park and after that is the Bird Park)

Recommended length of Visit: 3 hrs

Tips: Wear comfortable shoes as it is very big and carry water bottle.

Changkat Bukit Bintang



2 mins walk from Bukit Bintang, the only street as you can see in the picture above, lots of pubs and fine dining here. It is also a fun place to enjoy at night.



Jalan Alor

This is the famous place for street food or you can call it a food street. It's a heaven for those who loves food. But a strict "NO" for people who are Vegetarians. 2 min walk from Changkat Bukit Bintang.

Jalan Bukit Bintang

It's a must visit place. This area is the most happening place in KL. It has Restaurants, Clubs, Pubs and obviously shopping. 100's of Hotels. It is crowded at night also. I mean to say every night crowd is here but mostly on Saturdays. This place never sleeps.

Fee: Free

How to reach: Monorail Station, Bukit Bintang

Recommended length of visit: Depend on people



Chinatown (Petaling Street)

I don't know what to say about this "Petaling Street" because everybody said me not to go as here is a risk of theft, so if you are going then it is at your own risk and if you are carrying any bag then wear it in front. But still I went here but I didn't find any such thing what people said me but still have to be cautious. Great place to do shopping but need to bargain.

Fee: Free

How to reach: 2 mins walking from Pudu Raya Bus Station and one min from Central Market

Recommended Length of Visit: 1 hr.

Tips: Just be cautious about your belongings


It's a one day tour from Kuala Lumpur. I am here to tell you how to go to Genting on your own (without booking any tour package).

This is how I did it:

1) Bought ticket from Pudu Raya bus station: One day in advance




It's on the first floor counter no 27 (as you can see in the picture).



One way bus ticket plus Skyway transfer is RM10.60 for adult and RM9.5 for Child.

And there is some discount also if you will buy return ticket but its not advisable to buy because you never know how much time it can take. Also, there are specific bus timings so please be sure when you want to leave.

While returning back



- **6 hrs is must for Genting**
- **RM 6 to come down**
- **B-4 is the Bus Stand**
- **On the 3rd floor you will see the ticket counter but it's on the other side.**

4 days of fabulous KL

Day-1



There's a lot to do in Kuala Lumpur. But 4 days is more or less a decent time to see what KL is all about. KL has everything right from shopping, walking tours to nightlife and day tours.

AM: Merdeka Square (9am to 12.00)

Will start with a walking tour around Merdeka Square covering- KL city gallery, National music museum, National Textile Museum, Government office, Sultan Abdul Samad Building, KL city library, Victoria Fountain, Flag Pole.

It will take almost 3 hours. If you love old buildings, monuments etc. then this is the place for you.

PM: Family fun and Art Culture (2pm to 7pm)

Start from Deer Park, Butterfly Park (waste don't go), KL Bird Park (Must Visit), Police Museum, Islamic Art museum, National Mosque, National Planetarium etc..

AM: Genting Highlands (One day tour- 9am to 6pm)

Before going to hotel buy the bus ticket for Genting Highlands from Pudu Sentral or KL Sentral on Day 1.

Will start around 9am, it will take 2 hours to reach Genting. Enjoy indoor theme park, snow world, bowling, Ripley's museum, Casino and amazing Skyway Transfer. Great options for shopping and Vegetarian Food. Also, many different kinds of themed hotels.
